

Human-Nature: Delegation to Malaysia/Borneo - Open Call

Introduction

"Human-Nature" is our Malaysian 3-year programme of collaborations and partnerships between the UK and Malaysia Civil Society Organisations and arts sectors, to explore:

- Malaysia's cultural diversity and biodiversity, the alternative values system and ancestral knowledge,
- the threats and challenges climate change represents for cultural rights and practice,
- and to develop creative responses to climate adaptation that would benefit communities,
- and enable connections and collaborations to investigate climate change through arts, science and technology.

We are looking for seven (7) UK artists, arts organisation representatives, arts tech creatives and or producers, curators, to be selected over an **Expression of Interest** (EOI), to visit Kuala Lumpur, Sabah and Sarawak (Borneo States) over a 10-day period in March 2024. This immersion in the Borneo context and communities will be a unique chance for the group to participate in a research trip focussed on exploring and addressing climate change through arts, science and technology, to ignite conversations and inspire change. It will involve opportunities for the group to learn and increase their knowledge about climate change and adaptation in Borneo alongside building cultural connections with the Malaysian creative sector.

We are looking for a cross discipline, cross skills group of individuals who have a strong interest in developing their knowledge in this area, making new connections and have a special interest in Malaysia's cultural diversity and biodiversity. We are particularly interested in candidates who are keen to raise awareness and explore creative solutions for addressing climate change through the arts, technology and science which fore-front lived experience. We are also looking for participants who can create further legacy with the knowledge and experience gained through the research trip.

Objectives and Outcomes

The objectives of the delegation are 2 folds:

 Increase knowledge, understanding and interest of UK stakeholders about Malaysia's potential and opportunities for creative responses to climate adaptation.



• Generate new connections and the premises for long-term collaboration pathways (creative works, network...) and generate long-term partnerships.

The Opportunity: Delegation to Malaysia/Borneo

The delegation will be a curated study tour to enable UK delegates to better understand Malaysia's:

- Cultural and bio diversities, and more specifically its communities, their practices and knowledge.
- Impacts and issues, challenges, needs and opportunities caused by climate change.
- Stakeholders who work at the intersection of arts and climate in Malaysia.

Programme will be a combination of:

- meetings with artists, NGOs and CSOs, academics and sector experts, to understand their work and challenges in 3 locations.
- visits of cultural assets, biodiversity, and climate change centres.
- 2 rural communities' day-visits to meet with communities and understand the landscape and challenges.
- dialogues, brainstorming workshops and networking events with local artists, scientists,
 NGOs, officials.
- Alone times for reflections.

Dates: 29 February 2024 - 10 March 2024 (1 travel day + 10 days visit total)

29 February: Depart the UK

1 March: Arrive in KL

• 1 – 4 March: Programme in KL

4 – 7 March: Programme in Sarawak

• 7 – 10 March: Programme in Sabah

10 March: Depart for the UK

The participants will be expected to:

- be able to travel to Malaysia for a period of 10 days between 29 February and 10 March 2024 and fully take part in the programme.
- commit time before the project for preparation and research, including online briefing/preparation sessions with British Council and local stakeholders.
- document their experience and submit an essay/thought piece to be published on the British Council website.
- participate in the documentation, communication, wrap-around activities, and evaluation of the programme.



Who Can Apply?

We are looking for seven (7) UK artists, curators, creative producers, creative technologists who;

- are interested in developing collaborative opportunities with talents in Malaysia.
- have substantial professional experience and work at the intersection of arts and climate.
- have interest to integrate, study, broaden their understanding of indigenous practices in Malaysia, specifically Sabah and Sarawak.
- are highly creative and willing to collaborate with others.
- have strong network in the UK that can be activated to amplify the awareness and impact
 of the overall programme's activities and objectives.

Eligibility Criteria

Applications must be made by UK artists, curators, creative producers, creative technologists and cultural organisation representatives who:

- are based/living inside of the United Kingdom unless temporarily living but retaining a home address in the United Kingdom and defined by His Majesty's Revenue & Customs as 'resident the in the UK' for tax – see here.
- are able to travel to Malaysia for a period of 10 days between 29 February and 10 March 2024 and fully participate in the programme.
- Share the British Council's commitment to Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) and will embed best EDI practices into your activity. (Read the British Council's EDI Strategy and Policy <u>here</u>.

The delegation will be an unprecedented opportunity to:

- Return Economy flights.
- Hotel accommodation.
- Selected working lunches and dinners.
- Local transport in Malaysia: From and to airports, to organised meetings and visits.
- A grant of £1,200 as honorarium/per-diem to cover meals and your time during the delegation.
- Gain knowledge on Malaysia's arts sectors, its cultural diversities, and its biodiversity over a 10-days bespoke, curated programme.
- Make new connections with Malaysian stakeholders.
- Live an amazing cultural experience.
- Learn and share best practices.

More Information on Accessibility and Equality Diversity and Inclusion

The nature of this journey, visiting remote areas and engaging with rural communities, mean that it is not as accessible as we would like. The delegation will be a physically taxing journey and candidates will experience long haul travels (flights and car rides), and a tight schedule of meetings and visits over 10 days. Due to the climate and remoteness of some locations, it is important to note that adaptability / flexibility will be required to meaningfully engage with this study trip. There may be times when basic comfort and utilities will not be available: in remote areas, access to clean toilets, electricity, Wi-Fi, air conditioning, will be limited. There may be long walks under uncomfortable climate conditions (rain, thunderstorms, heat, and humidity and mosquitoes). Malaysia's infrastructures, generally, do not provide much access to the disabled community: wheelchairs access is limited in most buildings, street sidewalks and public transport, and services and expertise to support disable people are not available in remote areas where the delegation will take place.

We can cover the costs of accompanying access workers such as sign language interpreters for the selected delegates.

We welcome applicants form all ethnic backgrounds and origins, and from all parts of the UK and 4 Nations.

We will be briefing the delegates prior to and upon arrival in Malaysia. However, we highly recommend minimum research be conducted in order to better understand the context, history and cultural diversity and sensitivities of Malaysian cultures and ethnic groups.



Delegates will be required to follow an **Engagement Guide** that will be shared prior to the research trip.

About Human Nature

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The programme's main activities and timeline will be as follow:

- 1. Development of a community engagement guide by January 2024.
- 2. A research to map stakeholders (and initiatives) that work at the intersection of arts and climate adaptation in Malaysia and the UK, and identify future creative and artistic collaborations pathways that would create creative responses to climate adaptation and benefit communities in both regions.
- 3. Appointment of Malaysian delegation partners by December 2023: <u>Forever Sabah</u> and <u>Borneo Bengkel</u>.
- 4. UK Delegation to Malaysia 29 February 10 March 2024.
- 5. A creative collaboration open call (2024 Date TBC).
- 6. Showcasing and advocacy events in 2025.
